1. US Health and Human Services Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR) launches new Public Health Emergency Portal. The new PHE.gov (<http://www.phe.gov/>) acts as a cross governmental portal for residents in the U.S. and worldwide to obtain information from all U.S. federal agencies and their state and local partners involved in a public health emergency, medical disaster, or public health aspects of a natural or man-made disaster. Using this portal, visitors can find the current status and actions taken by the federal government in preparing for and responding to public health emergencies and medical disasters.

The portal also provides specific information for federal, state, and local emergency planners to aid in preparing for, responding to, and recovery from public health emergencies.
