



...Widespread Snow This Weekend...



Significant snowfall is expected over parts of southwest Montana with persistent light accumulating snow spreading to portions of central and north-central Montana by late Friday night and through early Sunday morning.

Easterly winds may be breezy at times causing areas of blowing/drifting snow along with reduced visibilities less than one half of a mile at times.






Snowfall Storm Total



Friday and Saturday Snowfall Totals



Arctic Temperatures Expected



Saturday Lows and Highs






Sunday Lows and Highs






Monday Lows and Highs





