



## **DISABILITY SELF-DISCLOSURE**



### **WHY:**

**Designated National Service personnel must be made aware of any disability in order to provide reasonable accommodations.**

**It is up to you to determine how much and to whom information about your disability is disclosed. Keep in mind, however, that efforts to provide reasonable accommodations for you depend on the information you provide.**

**The Montana Governor's Office of Community Service employs a "Disability Coordinator" who can maximize your service experience and guide you through the possibilities of volunteerism.**

**An individual with a disability who does not self-disclose has no protection from discriminatory practices under the Americans with Disabilities Act.**

### **WHO WILL KNOW:**

**Self-disclosure of a disability does not mean everyone will know about your disability. By law, this information must be kept confidential.**

### **GET INVOLVED:**
