| Campus Corps | This program is an evolution of the Montana Campus Corps, a program that has operated in the state for nearly two decades. This application represents a change to the MT Campus Corps model. A large number of slots previously granted through MT Campus Corps will be replaced by slots from the Compact Service Corps. MT Campus Corps and Compact Service Corps have been operating an AmeriCorps program in partnership for several years. |

| Compact Service Corps | The Compact Service Corps has been operating in Montana for several years but under the 2012 proposal would represent a major restructuring in national service in Montana. In essence 600+ members would move from the Montana Campus Corps, which will no longer exist, to the Compact Service Corps in Montana. |

| Energy Corps | The Energy Corps program, which originated as a formula program in Montana in 2009, is backed by a strong organization and has shown continuous improvement in the management of their program. They provide an excellent member experience and serve an important need. |

| Equal Justice Works | Equal Justice Works has been operating in Montana since 2006 and has found a strong partner in the Montana Legal Services Association (MLSA). Because MLSA also oversee AmeriCorps State and VISTA programs they are a bastion for cross stream service. |

| Jesuit Volunteer Corps Northwest | Jesuit Volunteer Corps Northwest provides added breadth to AmeriCorps service in Montana, they primarily target small communities focusing primarily on education but serving a wide variety of other community needs. |

| Student Conservation Association | The Student Conservation Association is, we believe, one of the premier service organizations in the nation and we are proud to have them in Montana. They work and communicate with other AmeriCorps programs in the state and provide great opportunities for Montana's youth. |

| Trout Corps | Trout Corps is hosted by a very strong and widely recognized organization in Trout Unlimited. Their members service, to preserve watersheds, addresses an important issue to the state. The one reservation of our commission is the existence of the Big Sky Watershed Corps, a formula program addressing similar watershed issues. However, both groups have been open in discussions toward the goal of ensuring that services will be complimentary and duplication avoided. |
