



Montana Governor's Office of Community Service AmeriCorps Planning Grant Concept Form

Purpose

This Concept Form serves two main functions:

- 1. As a <u>planning tool</u> to help organizations explore key AmeriCorps program elements without the burden of submitting a full application.
- 2. As a <u>screening tool</u> for OCS to assess the viability of applicants for AmeriCorps program funding competition based on eligibility, capacity to receive and expend federal AmeriCorps awards, and to ensure non-duplication of existing AmeriCorps programs.

Timeline

This concept form will be accepted on a rolling basis, throughout the year, to allow for greater transparency, accessibility, and opportunity for technical assistance in preparing an AmeriCorps grant application.

Concept forms must be submitted to <u>Serve@mt.gov</u> by March 30th of each year to be considered for the current year's funding cycle. Our office will respond within 10 business day of receipt of the form.

OCS will review submitted Planning Grant Concept forms, provide pre-application technical assistance, and guidance on next steps to the submitting organization.
