AmeriCorps consists of AmeriCorps State & National, AmeriCorps VISTA, NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps) and AmeriCorps Seniors.



Statewide, high school students are eligible to receive a Youth Serve Montana scholarship every year.

The Youth Serve Montana scholarship promotes volunteerism, encourages young leaders to further their education, and provides tuition assistance to Montana students attending college in-state. These scholarships are made possible by Montana Campus Network for Civic Engagement and Reach Higher Montana

Applications open each winter and awarded in the spring.

Montana State Service Plan

The Montana State Service Plan is a three-year framework for national service, community volunteerism, and Donate Life. The Plan is a requirement of AmeriCorps and Montana law. Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan sets strategic objectives, goals, and initiatives of the Montana Commission on Community Service.
